PRESIDENT'S LETTER

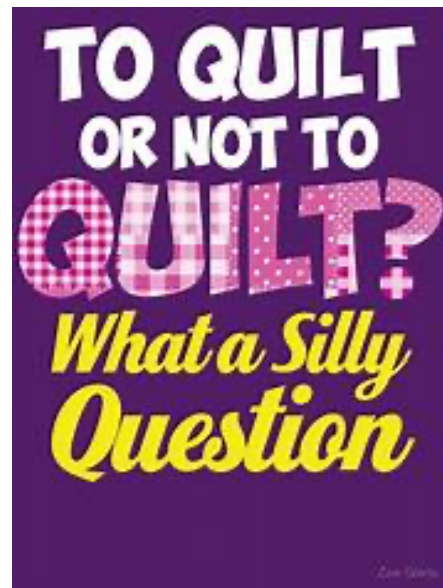

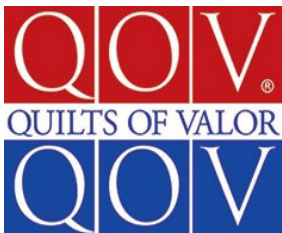

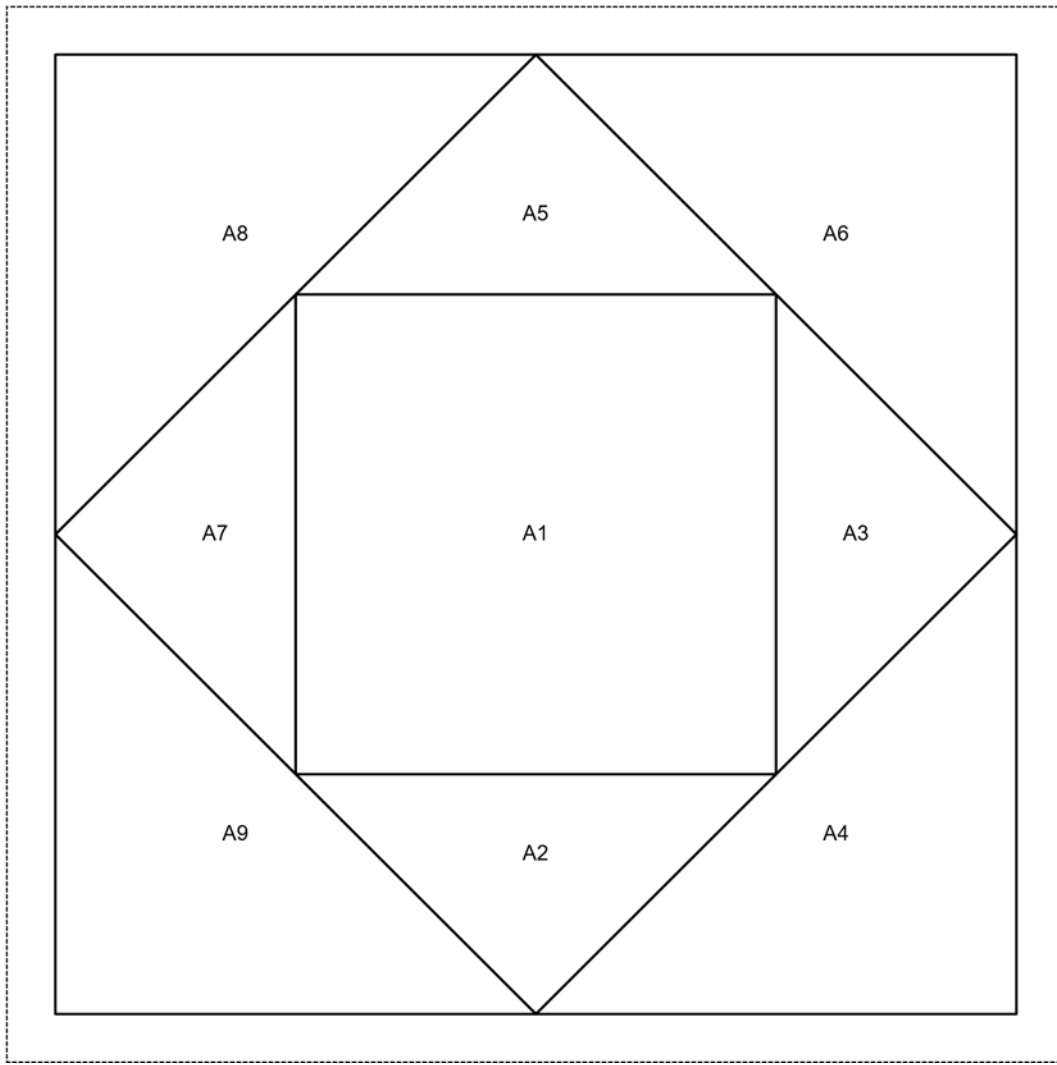

SRQG Name Tag Pattern

You may finish your badge in fabrics of your choice using the lightest in the center where your name should appear. Pieces A2, A3, A5 and A7 should be your darkest fabric. Use a medium value for the outer corners. The badge can be made to read square or on point, your choice! Embellish as desired.

Badge should finish at 5" square. Please make sure your printer is set to print at actual size rather than a reduced size. Any questions, call Linda Bryant

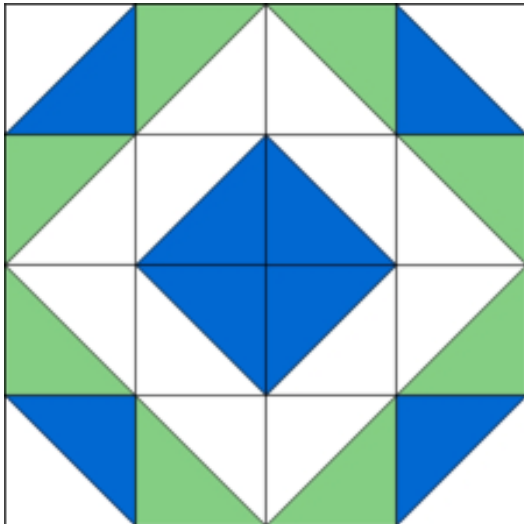

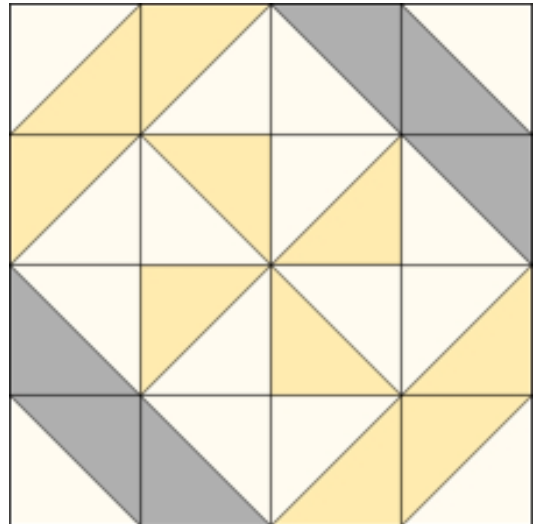

Terrific Triangles for May

Block 7 Depression Block



Block 8 Boxed Pinwheel



HST Instructions:

(Basic HST's for every block)

Cut the required number of 4" squares of background and print fabric for the block.

Place a background square on top of a print square, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the lighter square.

Sew an accurate 1/4" seam on either side of the drawn line.

Cut on the drawn line.

Press the seam to the darker fabric.

Trim the HST to 3 1/2". (Being mindful to place the points accurately in the corners of your ruler so they don't get cut off).

Repeat for the remaining squares for the block.

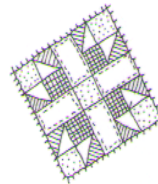

But here's the fine print, I will choose the design and the thread color(s) and there will be a \$40.00 minimum.
